YOUTH OPTIONS

WFU holds concurrent youth activities during select times of Convention weekend: Youth Co-op Convention (upper elementary through high school) and Childcare (infant-lower elementary).

The Youth Co-op Convention features a cooperative education program that is geared toward youth in 7th-12th grade. (Younger siblings and upper elementary youth are welcome, at parent discretion, in the Youth Co-op Convention; preferably if accompanied by an older sibling, parent, or youth leader.) The Youth Co-op Convention is held from 9am to 2pm on Saturday and 9am to noon on Sunday.

Childcare will be offered as needed at select times for our younger attendees (infant to lower elementary).

The Convention Youth Dance and Social (for all youth attendees; parents welcome) will be from 9-11:30pm on Saturday night. Supervision and a family movie may be provided (based on interest) for younger children after the banquet that evening as well.

A \$60 per youth registration fee covers meals and programming/childcare for ALL youth at Convention, from infant through high school. Meals include Saturday lunch and banquet, and Sunday breakfast and lunch.
